

School Highlights

For the 2017-2018 School Year, Lundar Early Years had two school goals:

- 1.By June 2018, all students will improve one grade level in their reading comprehension.
- 2. By June 2018, all students will improve by one grade level in their number concept understanding in mathematics.

To better be able to meet these goals, Lundar Early Years decided to allow all our students to learn at their ability level from grade 1-4 for ELA and numeracy instruction.

This ensured students were receiving 1.5 hours of ELA instruction and 1 hour of numeracy instruction daily at the level best meeting their needs and abilities. We hoped this would lead to more students reading and understanding math at their appropriate grade level.

Goal #1







By allowing the students to receive English Language Arts instruction for 1.5 hours every day at their level we have seen wonderful results!



By the end of the 2017/2018 school year we have 84% of our students reading within or above their appropriate grade level. On average, the students' reading levels went up by 1.2 grade levels.

Through this intensive instruction, we have realized our students need to continue to work on their writing skills. Therefore, next year more time will be allotted to developing the students' writing abilities, focusing on research, summarizing and creative writing.

Goal #2



Numeracy:

With our students receiving 1 hour of numeracy instruction each day, we have developed tremendous problem solvers and mathematical thinkers!

By the end of the 2017/2018 school year we had 82% of our students working in or above their appropriate grade level for numeracy.

Interventions:

This year we also pulled students out of their regular classroom settings for small group interventions in ELA and Numeracy when needed.

These groups were led by Mrs. Paslawsky and Ms. Pool. These intervention groups will continue to be used as a support for the students next year.
